Hello all CBPer's:

I have been asked to provide suggestions from our members (the CSZ) regarding the title or theme of at least **five** different symposia for the upcoming meeting of the ICCBP in Nagoya Japan in 2011. This is the same meeting as the one held in Santiago Brasil in 2007, La Trobe (Australia) meeting in 2003 and the Calgary meeting in 1999. The organizing committee will have a meeting at the upcoming IUPS meeting in Japan this summer discuss the format and select symposia for the meeting. I would like to solicit from our members suggestions for symposia including the title, 4-5 possible speakers and a short (~80-100 words only) summary of the theme of the symposia. I will need these suggestions by May 4 at the very latest. For each symposia suggested, the following guidelines are provided:

- a) Allotted time for each symposium will be 2hr 30min.
- b) Multiple organizers from different countries are recommended.
- c) format with four to five invited speakers + a couple of speakers from selected posters (for 30 min) are desirable.

Format of proposal:

1. Title of Symposium + (a field of interest, e.g. Muscle Physiology)
2. Organizers (Name, Title, Affiliation, Phone, Fax, e.mail)
3. Synopsis: within 300 words (Objectives, contribution to the meeting, etc.).
4. List of speakers*: Name, (Affiliation, E.mail), Tentative talk title.

* At this point you need not final confirmations from the speakers.

Above information should be mailed as an attached file (within one page in MSWORD

I will gather together all suggestions and submit them for the committee as a whole to discuss and accept/reject. Should any of these symposia suggestions be of similar nature to those proposed by other societies, we may have to work together with those other societies to present a jointly prepared symposium.
