The successful applicant will be expected to teach an introductory course in genetics, advanced courses in the candidate's area(s) of expertise and possibly other courses as required.

The application should consist of a cover letter, a description of research interests, a statement of the candidate's teaching philosophy, a curriculum vitae, and three representative publications.
